'Experience the Power of God'

GENERAL OVERVIEW

First of all thank you for choosing to be part of the *Expedition Promised Land*! We are on the train to heaven. I pray that the activities found in this kit help you and the children grow closer to the Lord Jesus Christ.

The Theme of this program is **Expedition Promised Land.** The foundational Scripture is the Israelite's expedition to Canaan, the promised land under the leadership of Joshua found in **Joshua chapters 1,2,6,7,8 and 11.** We will be training the children to experience the power of God. They will be referred to as **Travelers in God's Caravan to the Promised Land.** You as the **Administrator/ Coordinator** of Children's Ministry in your Church will be referred to as the **Master Guide.** Teachers are Caravan Leaders, and Volunteers will be referred to as **Expedition Corps.** Feel free to decorate the **CHILDREN MINISTRIES CAMP MEETING spaces to look like a Caravan Camp.** This is your chance to get creative and have fun!

The program is designed to run for a **whole day with regular healthy breaks**. We recommend that the caravans break for snacks during the small group time and for lunch after all the caravans have gone through most (if not all) the stations. The final large group program should start after lunch with a singing session and end with a skit.

In this kit you will find **teachers' manuals, children's activity books, and daily letters** for the children to take home and of course the manual in your hand. Along with the brief descriptions of each item below, take the time to go through each packet and familiarize yourself with all the material before meeting with your volunteers.

CONTENTS

Teachers' Handbooks

The teacher's handbook is to pass out to each of your actual instructors manning the various rotational stations. These are the adult helpers who will have the most direct contact with the children. The handbooks explain the games and activities in which the children will be participating in great detail. It also gives suggestions on what to say at each section to relieve as much stress as possible from the teachers. Their main job is to befriend the kids and act as mediators for the lessons. There are four sets of handbooks: *The Snack Conquest Handbook, The Wilderness Track Challenge Handbook, The Art Rotational Station Handbook* and *The Bible League Station Handbook.*

Daily Letters

These letters are an integral part of the **CHILDREN MINISTRIES CAMP MEETING** program. As every day comes to a close, be sure to send one of these notes home with every child. They tell what the travelers did that day, and give parents a heads up on what the children will be doing the next day. The purpose is to help bring the family together and get everyone involved in Expedition Bible Camp.

The Music kit

This comprises of a number of song lyrics to be taught and adapted for singing during the worship session. The songs are adapted to the **CHILDREN MINISTRIES CAMP MEETING** theme: Expedition Promised Land. The music leader will be responsible for teaching the travelers the music and co-coordinating with the worship team on the songs to be used.

The Craft's Handbook/Kit

This comprises of all the proposed crafts for each day and for each age group. The kit proposes a number of materials, but each church is encouraged to be creative and use the readily locally available materials as much as possible.

This Manual

As the administrator of **CHILDREN MINISTRIES CAMP MEETING**, it is your job to make sure everyone knows what they are doing and where they should be. You will also organize for the presentation of the large group lesson each morning. This book will help you manage all the volunteers with minimal stress on your part.

A strong crew of adult and teen volunteers is vital to any **CHILDREN MINISTRIES CAMP MEETING** week running smoothly. The most important thing to keep in mind is to be sure that all volunteers are working in their gifting. If someone is put into a situation with which they are uncomfortable, things will not work out as well as they could. Give your volunteers a chance to grow in the Lord by allowing them to use their spiritual gifts.

VOLUNTEERS

Teachers/Caravan Leaders

They will have the most contact with the children. They have to have patience and good listening skills. They must be able to convey the Biblical message in a meaningful way to the children. There should be enough teachers to have caravans of about ten Children each (or as the situation may dictate).

Kitchen Staff/cooks

These important individuals are responsible for the snacks and water for the children. They have to organize all the food and make sure water is available. Help them to stay as organized as possible and encourage them often, since they will probably be the least thanked of all the staff. In some situations, this may be an outside group hired for the purpose.

Drama Team

A group of teenagers and a few children would work well for this job. Let the team familiarize themselves with the themes and bible passages in good time so as to prepare the scripts a week or so before so they have time to practice. Be sure to help them gather all the necessary materials (props) and

Costumes they will need. If the members feel comfortable with it, they can also double as the worship leaders.

Worship Team

Teenagers make great worship leaders for **CHILDREN MINISTRIES CAMP MEETING**, too. It is a chance to help budding worship leaders grow into their roles. Maybe some drama team members would be willing to help out in this department. A technical individual would be useful too. At least a week before camp, help them to prepare slideshows (or notes, books or whatever materials is available) with the lyrics to the chosen worship songs. Limit the number of songs to four songs per day. Make sure the lyrics are on level children can comprehend.

Music Leaders

They will work with the worship team to lead the travelers in a singing session during the large group session. They will also be responsible for teaching the travelers new songs relevant to the expedition theme, preferably after the small group sessions, but before the final large group session.

First Aid/Medics

With a large group of children, there are bound to be injuries. Have a few first-aid certified adults around and be well stocked in first aid items. Have a medic stationed near the physical activity area, as this is where most injuries are likely to occur.

Crafts/Expedition Experience – Craft Leader

If your church is small enough, the teachers can handle this job as they have all the information they need in their book, but if you get enough volunteers, it would be nice to have someone to lead crafts so the teachers can discuss the application of the activity while the craft leader works out the technicalities of the project. A patient individual is best here, as the children will be nasty when they see all the supplies they will get to use.

Physical Activity Leaders/Wilderness scouts

The teachers could do this, but they would be better off watching and encouraging the travelers as they play the game. The physical activity leader should be a loud, outgoing and energetic person who is not afraid to lay down the law when the need arises. Children may get too competitive here and need someone to rein them in. Have helpers around for the physical activity leader to lead the teams in the game and for extra eyes on the field. Teenagers would be great and would probably enjoy playing with the kids, too.

Helpers

A mass of people to run around and set things up, tear them down and run around and make sure everyone's needs are met. Helpers are great for making copies, running from one side of the church to the other to get more water. They can also help clean up from snack time and craft time. The decorators

Fall into this category, as do those who will help advertise **CHILDREN MINISTRIES CAMP MEETING** in months leading up to it. Helpers are typically humble, servant-oriented people who prefer to be behind the scenes

LARGE GROUP TIME

Pastor's overview

Every day you will coordinate the large group discussion at the beginning of **CHILDREN MINISTRIES CAMP MEETING camp**. This is what sets the tone for the whole day and will be the first presentation of the lesson they get, so they should be more alert now than they will be the rest of the day. There is a theme for each day to guide in this session. Since this session can be done by a pastor or any other church leader who is not necessarily involved in the camp for the whole period, it is very important that the theme as provided in this manual is strictly followed to avoid confusing the travelers. It is also important that the session is kept short – a maximum of 15 minutes to avoid tiring the kids even before they start the day's activities.

Musical Worship

Worship takes place during the opening large group session. The music leader will coordinate with the worship team on the songs to be used. On day one, the team may use the familiar songs regularly used in the Sabbath school classes, however, as the days progress, the music leader is expected to have taught new relevant songs to be used during the worship.

SMALL GROUP TIME (ROTATIONAL STATIONS)

The caravans can rotate through the activities in small group time, depending on the number of caravans you have. If you choose to do this, prepare a schedule a week or two in advance. Make sure you have enough rooms or secluded spaces so each small group can work without distractions of other groups.

Wilderness Trail Challenge/Outdoor Game

A big, grassy field would be best for all the games, but a parking lot will work too. Just make sure there are not any cars around. All the outdoor games tie in directly with the day's big idea. Be sure you understand the connection so you can help the children understand as well. Each day has a number of suggested games. The wilderness scouts would need to review and choose the games considered most appropriate for each caravan.

Water/snack conquest

This is a time for the children to enjoy and rehydrate as they seek to experience God's power through the Israelite's conquest story and healthy eating. This is not the normal health break but a rotational

Station meant to enhance the theme of the day as the children enjoy some bits of health food. The caravan leader may use this station to remind the travelers of their need to help other less fortunate children to also experience the power of God through their gifts. The children could be asked in advance, before the camp starts, to prepare gifts for donations to a children's home, a hospital or any other community project the leader may decide. The children would therefore be asked to submit their gifts at this time.

Scripture discussion/Activity book

The activity book will help reinforce everything the travelers learn throughout the day. This is a time for the caravan leaders to sit down with their caravan and answer any questions they may have. At the very beginning, the teachers should lead a brief discussion on the things learned so far.

Crafts/Expedition Experience

This activity could take some time, so be sure the craft area is well organized and well stocked. Cover the floors and tables with newspapers and cloths to protect the room. Encourage the children to work efficiently so they have time to finish their craft project. Be sure you provide a place to store all the craft items for the week. You need room for everything to dry. One idea for storage is to designate an area in the craft room for each caravan. From there, label each space with each child's name and stack the things up there, or place them in a large paper bag with the child's name and caravan on it.

LARGE GROUP TIME

Close in a large group time so parents can pick their children up exactly where they dropped them off. This also allows you to nicely wrap up the day.

Singing Session

The music leader leads the whole team in songs practice. He/she would use this time to teach the children the various theme songs for the camp – some of which would be used for the first large group session worship. We have provided a music kit with this manual that could be used by the music leader.

Closing Discussion

End the day with a discussion of everything covered that day, from the big idea to the small group activities. Drive home the practical application of expedition experience discussed that day. Keep this short, then introduce and set up the skit.

Skit

A short skit ends the day on a light note and presents the big idea in yet another manner to be sure everyone gets it. This comes at the end of the day rather than at the beginning because the children are tired, and need a fun, easy-to-follow presentation of the lesson. Ensure the drama team is ready and prepared to adequately illustrate the day's theme.

Prayer

Close in prayer and be sure every child gets a daily letter - "The Expedition Continues" takes home sheet for that day. They do not need to bring these back; they are just to benefit the family.

MAKING IT YOUR OWN

This program is meant to be a guide to help you create the best **CHILDREN MINISTRIES CAMP MEETING** experience for your group. Take creative license in personalizing it for your circumstances. Make use of local materials as much as possible. If your budget allows, consider making t-shirts for the children and/or volunteers. Make sure they are distinct designs or colors to help tell people apart by caravan and/or job description. Divide the caravan into three age groups: **Ages 3 – 6**; **Ages 7-10**; **and ages 11 – 14.**

Don't forget to find some way to thank your volunteers at the end to the week by presenting them with a small gift and short note. To follow with the theme, you could give all the volunteers camouflage t-shirts that say, "I survived Expedition Promised Land," or whatever you find appropriate.

DAILY BREAKDOWN

DAY ONE: GOD IS OUR STRENGTH

Preparation Time:

Every day one of your first responsibilities is to help prepare the volunteers for their duties. Meet with everyone half an hour before you have children arrive to allow yourself time to answer questions, give a rundown of the day's plan, and most importantly, pray as a group. During this time, check on the following:

- Worship team: Are the worship materials (slide shows, notes or books) up and ready to go?
- **Pastor or first speaker**: Is the person designated to present the pastor's overview present and prepared?
- **Drama team**: Have all your materials (props)? Memorized the script?
- **Crafts department**: Are all the supplies laid out for the first group? The area protected with newspapers? Designated area labeled for project storage?
- **Snack conquest team:** Have enough snacks for the planned activities? Do you have an area set up for the community project donations?
- **Medics:** Do you have all your supplies, and is your tent/area set up? Are you aware of any children with particular health needs, such as diabetes or asthma, etc.?
- **Wilderness trail challenge leaders**: Is your area cleared of all debris? Do you have all the materials you need and do you understand the rules of the planned activities?
- Teachers: Any questions on today's lesson? Do you have your caravan roster?

Sign in and large group discussion:

Helpers can man the sign in table and make sure all travelers find their caravan leaders. Each caravan leader should raise the caravan's standard (flag) and each traveler should settle next to his/her flag. Once everyone is settled, continue with the following:

Once everyone settles in, **pray** as a group. Introduce the day's big idea and then invite the person presenting the pastor's overview. Make sure to brief the presenter on the time and theme requirements ahead of time. Note that this session should not take more than **15 minutes.**

After the presentation, lead the children/travelers in the reciting the memory verse of the day.

Say: God is our strength: God appointed Joshua as the leader after the death of Moses and instructed him to be strong and courageous as He would be with him as long as he remained faithful. Our memory verse for today is found in Philippians 4: 13 which say – "I can do all things through him who gives me strength."

Say: Can we all say it together: "I can do all this through him who gives me strength." Repeat until satisfied that all the travelers have memorized the verse.

Say: Today we are standing on the verge of the Jordan River ready to go over to the Promised Land. Our great leader, **Moses has died but God is still with us.** We are going to experience the power of God on our expedition promised land.

Invite the worship team to take over in singing and worship before breaking into small group time.

Small Group Time:

Ensure there is a clear schedule for the caravans for the small group time. I.e. which caravan goes to which station and in which order. Your responsibility in this time is to bounce around each station and see how the volunteers and caravans are doing. Enjoy watching everyone grow in the Lord in this time! Time at each station should not exceed 40 minutes. After 35 minutes, ring a bell to alert the caravan leaders that it is time to move to the next station.

Large Group Time:

Help the music leader organize the children for a music session/practice. At this time, the music leader may introduce new songs relevant to the theme while also practicing the songs already learnt. Enjoy the music with the children and thank God for the joy of worshiping God in music.

After the music, give a brief recap of the day, emphasizing the theme and the big idea.

Say: Today we have begun our expedition promise land. We had many challenges but learnt that God is our strength. We can do all things through Christ who gives us strength.

Introduce the drama team and read the setting, then enjoy it with the children. **Pray** as a group. **Send** home notes for tomorrow with every child.

Afterwards: Meet with all volunteers to pray and discuss the day's happenings. What did you learn about your students? Did you have any problems with kids getting along or not listening or not

Participating? How can you solve these problems for tomorrow? What went really well and how can you keep this up for the rest of the week?

DAY TWO: WE CAN TRUST IN GOD.

Preparation Time:

Every day one of your first responsibilities is to help prepare the volunteers for their duties. Meet with everyone half an hour before you have children arrive to allow yourself time to answer questions, give a rundown of the day's plan, and most importantly, pray as a group. During this time, check on the following:

Say: We can trust in God: Joshua sent two spies to a fortified Jericho city. The spies trusted on the power of God to deliver them and the city to them in spite of the mighty walls. God validated their faith when they chatted with Rahab. Rahab told them in Joshua 2:8 that she knew that the LORD had given the Israelites the land, and that the fear of them had fallen upon the inhabitants of Jericho and that they melted away before the Israelites. Our memory verse for today is found in Hebrews 11:1 which says – "Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see."

Say: Can we all say it together: "Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." Hebrew 11:1

Repeat until satisfied that all the travelers have memorized the verse.

Say: We are still on the verge of the Jordan River ready to go over to the Promised Land. Yesterday we learnt about the death of our leader Moses but we were encouraged that God is still with us. We started experiencing the power of God on our expedition promised land. Today, we are sending two spies to that mighty city Jericho. We can trust God that He is going to safely deliver the spies back and also deliver the city to us.

Invite the worship team to take over in singing and worship before breaking into small group time.

Small Group Time:

Ensure there is a clear schedule for the caravans for the small group time. I.e. which caravan goes to which station and in which order. Your responsibility in this time is to bounce around each station and see how the volunteers and caravans are doing. Enjoy watching everyone grow in the Lord in this time! Time at each station should not exceed 40 minutes. After 35 minutes, ring a bell to alert the caravan leaders that it is time to move to the next station.

Large Group Time:

Help the music leader organize the children for a music session/practice. At this time, the music leader may introduce new songs relevant to the theme while also practicing the songs already learnt. Enjoy the music with the children and thank God for the joy of worshiping God in music.

Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. (Hebrews 11:1)

Introduce the drama team and read the setting, then enjoy it with the children. Pray as a group.

Send home notes for tomorrow with every child.

Afterwards: Meet with all volunteers to pray and discuss the day's happenings. What did you learn about your students? Did you have any problems with kids getting along or not listening or not participating? How can you solve these problems for tomorrow? What went really well and how can you keep this up for the rest of the week?

DAY THREE: OBEDIENCE ENABLES GOD TO ACT FOR US

Say: Can we all say it together: "By faith the walls of Jericho fell, after the army had marched around them for seven days." Hebrews 11:30

Repeat until satisfied that all the travelers have memorized the verse.

Say: Today we conquer the mighty Jericho. We trust in God and we cannot fail. He will act for us in a mighty way. Yesterday, we sent two spies to that mighty city Jericho and they brought us a good report. We are, therefore, ready to conquer the city. The Lord is going to do great things for us.

Invite the worship team to take over in singing and worship before breaking into small group time.

Small Group Time:

Ensure there is a clear schedule for the caravans for the small group time. I.e. which caravan goes to which station and in which order. Your responsibility in this time is to bounce around each station and see how the volunteers and caravans are doing. Enjoy watching everyone grow in the Lord in this time! Time at each station should not exceed 40 minutes. After 35 minutes, ring a bell to alert the caravan leaders that it is time to move to the next station.

Large Group Time:

Introduce the drama team and read the setting, then enjoy it with the children. **Pray** as a group.

Send home notes for tomorrow with every child.

Afterwards: Meet with all volunteers to pray and discuss the day's happenings. What did you learn about your students? Did you have any problems with kids getting along or not listening or not participating? How can you solve these problems for tomorrow? What went really well and how can you keep this up for the rest of the week?

Preparation Time:

Every day one of your first responsibilities is to help prepare the volunteers for their duties. Meet with everyone half an hour before you have children arrive to allow yourself time to answer questions, give a rundown of the day's plan, and most importantly, pray as a group. During this time, check on the following:

- Worship team: Are the worship materials (slide shows, notes or books) up and ready to go?
- Pastor or first speaker: Is the person designated to present the pastor's overview present and prepared?
- Drama team: Have all your materials (props)? Memorized the script?
- Crafts department: Are all the supplies laid out for the first group? The area protected with newspapers? Designated area labeled for project storage?
- Snack conquest team: Have enough snacks for the planned activities? Do you have an area set up for the community project donations?
- Medics: Do you have all your supplies, and is your tent/area set up? Are you aware of any children with particular health needs, such as diabetes or asthma, etc.?
- Wilderness trail challenge leaders: Is your area cleared of all debris? Do you have all the materials you need and do you understand the rules of the planned activities?
- Teachers: Any questions on today's lesson? Do you have your caravan roster?
- Helpers: Is everything set up? Do you all have a post to attend today? Are all the rooms for the small group time ready?
- Does everyone have the small group schedule for today?
- Convey the big idea to the group.
- Pray together.

Sign in and large group discussion:

Helpers can man the sign in table and make sure all travelers find their caravan leaders. Each caravan leader should raise the caravan's standard (flag) and each traveler should settle next to his/her flag. Once everyone is settled, continue with the following:

Once everyone settles in, **pray** as a group. Introduce the day's big idea and then invite the person presenting the pastor's overview. Make sure to brief the presenter on the time and theme requirements ahead of time. Note that this session should not take more than 15 minutes.

After the presentation, lead the children/travelers in the reciting the memory verse of the day.

Say: God hates sin: Achan openly disobeyed God's instruction to completely destroy the city of Ai and everything therein. God dealt with the sin of Achan by ordering his death and of his whole family. God hates sin and will eventually destroy every sin in the world. If we continually rebel against God, He will eventually destroy the world with us. Our memory verse for today is found in Romans 1:18 which says – "God's anger is shown from heaven against all the evil and wrong things people do. By their own evil lives they hide the truths"

Say: Can we all say it together: "God's anger is shown from heaven against all the evil and wrong things people do. By their own evil lives they hide the truth." Romans 1:18 (NCV)

Repeat until satisfied that all the travelers have memorized the verse.

Say: Yesterday we conquered the mighty Jericho. We trusted in God and for sure we did not fail. However, something terrible is going to happen today. One of us committed a horrible sin and the Lord will deal with that sin in a terrible way today. You know God really hates sin and I pray that none of us is in the habit of sinning for that is really horrible!

Invite the worship team to take over in singing and worship before breaking into small group time.

Small Group Time:

Ensure there is a clear schedule for the caravans for the small group time. I.e. which caravan goes to which station and in which order. Your responsibility in this time is to bounce around each station and see how the volunteers and caravans are doing. Enjoy watching everyone grow in the Lord in this time! Time at each station should not exceed 40 minutes. After 35 minutes, ring a bell to alert the caravan leaders that it is time to move to the next station.

Large Group Time:

Help the music leader organize the children for a music session/practice. At this time, the music leader may introduce new songs relevant to the theme while also practicing the songs already learnt. Enjoy the music with the children and thank God for the joy of worshiping God in music.

After the music, give a brief recap of the day, emphasizing the theme and the big idea.

Say: Today was a bad day for us. We tried to capture Ai, a small city but we were horribly defeated and some of us killed. It was because of Achan who had disobeyed and sinned against God. God dealt with that sin in a terrible way. Achan together with his family was stoned to death. God really hates sin! Remember "God's anger is shown from heaven against all the evil and wrong things people do. By their own evil lives they hide the truth." Romans 1:18 (NCV)

DAY FIVE: GOD ALONE CAN DELIVER US
